Collaboration is key to Alliance events' success

Daily Health Walks hosted by the OMS Foundation Alliance, a staple of the AAOMS Annual Meeting for 28 years, trace their origins and longevity to a pharmacist's passion for fitness, an



enduring friendship and an appreciation of how one can beget the other. The friendship between Garry Persons (pharmacist, jogger, humanitarian healthcare volunteer and current President of Canfield, Inc.) and Dr. Bill Frantzich (AAOMS member and inventor of The Jaw Bra) embodies the spirit of fellowship and fun that also defines the Alliance. As collaborators, they were a natural fit.

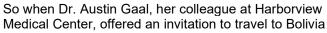
During his first career as a pharmacist, Mr. Persons organized and led daily jogs (and a Fastest Pharmacist Race!) at the American Society of Hospital Pharmacists' annual meetings. When he switched gears to launch Canfield, Inc., he floated a

proposal to AAOMS for a daily jog during its Annual Meeting, offering to provide T-shirts for participants.

His idea found a collaborator in the newly launched OMS Foundation Alliance; a social walk along Miami Beach at the 1996 Annual Meeting meshed perfectly with the Alliance's mission to foster lasting friendships among AAOMS spouses and families. The walks became a fixture of the AAOMS meetings, and vintage Health Walk T-shirts remain a prized possession among the many participants who return every year. Dr. Frantzich, whose Jaw Bra was marketed by Canfield, was an enthusiastic collaborator, offering financial support for a post-walk breakfast for participants to enhance the networking experience. Healing the Children with GIVE

As a dental student and OMS resident, some of Dr. Leena Zurayk's most gratifying moments occurred while working as a local volunteer providing care to those without healthcare access.





with Healing the Children, Dr. Zurayk recognized her next-level service opportunity. The combination of community service and immersive instruction in cleft repair from internationally renowned surgeons felt like the opportunity of a lifetime – one that would have been out of reach if not for a Global Initiative for Volunteerism and Education (GIVE) stipend from the OMS

Foundation. The \$2,500 GIVE stipend removed the financial hurdles of international travel, allowing Dr. Zurayk to focus on providing care to a community in need.

She and Dr. Gaal joined a team of surgeons, nurses, speech and language pathologists and anesthesiologists – led by Emory University OMS Chair Dr. Steven Roser – in Santa Cruz for a fast-paced week in January. Some 130 patients were triaged on Day 1. The team completed 74 procedures in five days, with Bolivian oral surgeons working alongside the visiting OMSs while multiple local medical students observed. Your donations at work: GIVE stipend earns a "thank you" from US Ambassador to Malawi

Drs. Tania Nkungula and Lt. Cmdr. Shelby Curtis (USN, chief resident at Walter Reed Medical Center) first learned of the GIVE opportunity on April 26, 2023, at the Middle Atlantic Society of OMS meeting. Thanks to the Foundation's responsive Committee on Humanitarian Programs and staff, Dr. Curtis was approved for a GIVE stipend before Dr. Nkungula's team departed for Malawi on May 27, where they provided much-needed support to the sole OMS practicing in that tiny African country. On the eve of their departure, the U.S. Ambassador to Malawi sent the following letter of gratitude to the Foundation for supporting this effort.

Dear all.

As Ambassador of Malawi, and taking this maiden trip with such eminent people, I feel



humbled. I do not take for granted all the sacrifice that each one of you is making for the people of Malawi. I pray that you will find your trip and service to Malawi fulfilling and worth every moment as part of your calling.

We pray that there will be many more of such trips and that life for the many Malawians awaiting such expert service will never be the same. I can speak for Dr. Mchenga, the only Oral Surgeon in Malawi, who is very dedicated to duty and serving with very limited resources, that this will take off a great load over his shoulders.

As the Chinese proverb says, a journey of a thousand miles begins with one step, Saturday May 27th is the beginning of that journey!!!! God bless you all.
